French Agricultural and Land Background (1)

A very agricultural country

First Agricultural Country of the EU:

- 3,5% of the GDP, 65 M € (incl. agro-food business)
- agriculture : 53% of the French area
- 500 000 farms, 3,4% of active population

A regulated land market

Land planning by local authorities (at various territorial levels)


SAFER and their mission: regulating the land market and promoting the setting-up of farmers

Corpus of law protecting farmers' rights


But some difficulties...

French Agricultural and Land Background (2)

Decrease in farm numbers and agricultural area



Farms: - 50% in 22 years




Area: -75 000 ha/year on average (1988-2010), with an acceleration in 2000-2010

French Agricultural and Land Background (3)

Pressure on agricultural land

> An increase in farm size



+ 50% in 22 years

> An increase in land prices : + 75% in 14 years (3030 €/ha in 1997, 5360 €/ha in 2011).

Organic Agriculture in France

Not enough organic!

Almost 40% off organic products are imported, French agriculture does not meet the growing demand of consumers.

Only 3,5 % of agricultural areas are cultivated in organic farming, while the government took a commitment to reach 20% in10 hears.

Access to land is a major obstacle to the development of organic agriculture, in particular for future farmers who are new entrants.

At the root of Terre de Liens...

Terre de liens was born out of the encounter of several movements around the issue of rural and agricultural land:

- People's Education
- Creation of social and economic activities in rural areas
- Ethical Finance
- Organic and Biodynamic Agriculture

Few dates...

1998 - 2003: maturation of the project within the people's education association RELIER. The association Terre de Liens was born in 2003.

2003 - 2006: publication by Terre de Liens of a resource handbook and technical support to collective land ownership schemes.

2006: Creation of the Foncière, with the goal of raising citizens' savings

2007-2010: Creation of regional associations.

2009: Creation of the Endowment Fund, with the goal of receiving donations and legacies.

2013: Transformation of the Endowment Fund into a Foundation "recognised as being in the public interest"

The mission of Terre de Liens

1- Preserving agricultural land and ensuring good land stewardship (land=commons)

- * Fostering an evolution of people's connection to land and individual ownership
- * Freeing land from land and real estate speculation

2- Constructing collective responsibility


Enabling all local stakeholders and citizens to get involved in land management, creating relationships, fostering the evolution of agricultural models.

3- Contributing to the development of organic, biodynamic and peasant farming

It rests on the principles stated in Terre de liens Charter:

- 1/ Supporting socially, economically and ecologically sustainable projects
- 2/ Encouraging collective and solidarity-based dynamics between in rural and periurban areas
- 3/ Reinforcing, through concrete actions, the public debate on land as a commons

The Terre de liens Movement



Concrete actions

- Supporting and advising collective acquisition schemes (SCI, GFA,...)
- **Acquiring farms** (buying or receiving as donation), with the aim of enabling the setting-up or continuation of peasant farmers (organic, biodynamic, short-supply chains agriculture) and land preservation.

- Citizen Mobilisation:

- through public debates, conferences, training...
- through ethical finance (raising savings and donations for farm acquisition)

- Intervention on territories:

- Collaborative work with a network of partners (Organic ag, CSA,...)
- Raising awareness of 'conventional' agricultural and land bodies
- Working with local authorities and local elected representatives (awareness-raising, training, supporting projects...)
- Advocacy and participation in public debate
- Participation to a European network!


Some results...

Since 2003:

> 20 regional associations

> About **10 000 citizens** mobilised and active in Terre de liens

- > Over **150 farmers** set up or maintained
- > A hundred farms acquired, or in the process of being acquired
- > Over **2200 hectares** dedicated to organic and peasant farming
- > Over 200 future farmers supported every year
- > An increasing number of partnerships with local authorities



Current challenges and next steps

A complex movement, celebrating its 10th anniversary, which has grown very quickly:

> Combining unity and diversity:

- * TDL is made of several organisations with different legal status
- * 20 regional associations, 20 origins and development, 20 local contexts
- * The reform of the constitution in 2010
- * A common strategic project under construction
- * The need to consolidate a common political thought

> Managing the farms as well as possible :

- * Relationships with the farmers
- * Issue of managing buildings
- > Ensuring the financial viability of the Movement in the long run
- > Implementing the full implications of having a Foundation recognised by the State as being in the public interest
