

Conservation and promotion of resources in small private forests.





The purpose of the REGIOWOOD project is to develop permanent means of promotion of wood as a material within small private properties in our forests.

Area: 379 ha Land-plots: 1191 Landowners: 249 **Private property**



REGIOWOOD is an INTERREG project with 19 partners. This project covers a large scale territory which is representative of the north-west European rural environment. During 3 years (from october 2008 to october 2011) this cross-border partnership between Wallonia (Belgium), Grand-Duché de Luxembourg, Lorraine (France) and Rheinland-Pfalz (Germany) allowed all the members of the forest and wood network to meet and share their visions of the small private forest. The final purpose is a better knowledge of the territory to ensure a good match between wood resources and economical, social and ecological supplies in a sustainable management perspective.
